The Sisters of Holy cross of the U.S. Region, having served for 127 years at Holy Angels Parish, St. Albans,Vt, are called to bring closure to their long time dedication. Having answered to the needs of the parish in the areas of education and pastoral support, the painful decision was made to surrender the mission of Liberation through Education by empowering many parishioners to take over the various tasks assigned to them by Rev. Maurice Roy, pastor of Holy Angels Church.

On June 19, in order to recognize our Congregation, and in particular the two retiring sisters, Lucille Dutilly and Patricia St.Hilaire, the devoted Pastor and the Parish Community organized a memorable gathering with a Mass of Thanksgiving to honor the event which carried many emotions. Present were: Bishop Coyne of the Diocese of Burlington, VT, a visiting Bishop of South Africa, the Pastor, Fr. Maurice Roy, Msgr. Reid Mayo, of Barry, VT, and a delegation of priests and Sisters of Holy Cross from NH. The packed Church of parishioners and of former students was a testimony of the appreciation of the long years of service.

Bishop Coyne made reference to the fact that Sisters Lucille and Patricia served with "sacrificial love": that of giving themselves, touching the lives of many children through teaching and reaching out to the parish community with their prayerful presence, sharing their talents and devoting themselves untiringly with love in innumerable services. He added that though the departure of the sisters creates a void in the parish, trust in



Fr. Roy's seasoned abilities and dedication of the parishioners will come to the fore.

Hearts were moved as the choir offered a special composition which perfectly reflected the sentiments of the parish; "We will miss you here". The gathering that followed at the parish hall restated the appreciation of the past. We salute the Ladies of St. Anne who organized the outstanding and magnificent banquet, which proved again the wonderful spirit at Holy Angels.

It was indeed painful for the Sisters who were leaving to accept so much attention after living such a humble and happy presence for many years in St. Albans. Others, who served long ago, though saddened, placed their trust in new beginnings!

Sr. Florence was born in New Bedford, MA, and entered the Sisters of Holy Cross in 1942. She taught in elementary schools in Springfield, MA, Rochester, Nashua and Manchester, NH. Sister also taught High School at St. Anthony and Trinity High in Manchester. She was a dedicated and prayerful religious of Holy Cross for 73 years. n Thursday, May 19, 2016, Saint Anselm College sponsored a luncheon to thank Sister Irene Ricard, CSC, and Sister Frances Lessard, CSC, for their years of service at the College. They were recognized as outstanding educators, women of wisdom and compassion who had a great influence on the lives of their students. Both have recently retired from their teaching careers.



At this same luncheon, we learned that a new building on the campus of St. Anselm College is being named *Holy Cross Hall* to honor all the Sisters

of Holy Cross on our 175th Jubilee Year of the founding of the women's branch of the Congregation of Holy Cross.

When Notre Dame College closed, some of the sisters who ministered at that institute applied for positions at Saint Anselm. This event honored them as well. Thus, the Holy Cross legacy lives on at "St. A's". They are Sisters Pauline Lucier, who ministered in the Office of Campus Ministry until she succumbed to a long battle with cancer in 2009; Anne Hoffler who worked in the campus bookstore; Judith Langevin, Administrative Assistant to the Vice President for Enrollment Management; and Diane Dupere, Administrative Assistant in the Office of Admission. Dr. Alicia Finn, Holy Cross Companion, is currently serving the student population at Saint Anselm as Dean of Students.

The College also wanted to show its gratitude for all Sisters of Holy Cross who contributed to higher education throughout the state of New Hampshire.
